# Welcome

AWS Resource Explorer is a resource search and discovery service. By using Resource Explorer, you can explore your resources using an internet search engine-like experience. Examples of resources include Amazon Relational Database Service (Amazon RDS) instances, Amazon Simple Storage Service (Amazon S3) buckets, or Amazon DynamoDB tables. You can search for your resources using resource metadata like names, tags, and IDs. Resource Explorer can search across all of the AWS Regions in your account in which you turn the service on, to simplify your cross-Region workloads.

Resource Explorer scans the resources in each of the AWS Regions in your AWS account in which you turn on Resource Explorer. Resource Explorer [creates and maintains an index](#) in each Region, with the details of that Region's resources.

You can [search across all of the indexed Regions in your account](#) by designating one of your AWS Regions to contain the aggregator index for the account. When you [promote a local index in a Region to become the aggregator index for the account](#), Resource Explorer automatically replicates the index information from all local indexes in the other Regions to the aggregator index. Therefore, the Region with the aggregator index has a copy of all resource information for all Regions in the account where you turned on Resource Explorer. As a result, views in the aggregator index Region include resources from all of the indexed Regions in your account.

# AssociateDefaultView

Sets the specified view as the default for the AWS Region in which you call this operation. When a user performs a [Search](#) that doesn't explicitly specify which view to use, then AWS Resource Explorer automatically chooses this default view for searches performed in this AWS Region.

If an AWS Region doesn't have a default view configured, then users must explicitly specify a view with every Search operation performed in that Region.

## Minimum permissions

To call this operation, you must have the following permissions:

- **Action:** `resource-explorer-2:AssociateDefaultView`

**Resource:** No specific resource (\*). However, an index must be present in the AWS Region in which you call the operation.

## Related operations

- To remove a view as the default for an AWS Region, use [DisassociateDefaultView](#).
- To list the available views, use [ListViews](#).
- To find which view is the default, use [GetDefaultView](#).

## Errors

## InternalServerError

HTTP Status Code: 404

## ThrottlingException

# BatchGetView

Retrieves details about a list of views.

## Minimum permissions

To call this operation, you must have the following permissions:

- **Action:** `resource-explorer-2:BatchGetView`

**Resource:** No specific resource (\*).

[This action supports using condition keys to check the tags attached to the view to limit permissions.](#)

- **Action:** `resource-explorer-2:GetView`

**Resource:** the ARN of each view you want to retrieve.

[This action supports using condition keys to check the tags attached to the view to limit permissions.](#)

# CreateIndex

Turns on AWS Resource Explorer in the AWS Region in which you called this operation by creating an index. Resource Explorer begins discovering the resources in this Region and stores the details about the resources in the index so that they can be queried by using the [Search](#) operation. You can create only one index in a Region.

## Note

This operation creates only a *local* index. To promote the local index in one AWS Region into the aggregator index for the AWS account, use the [UpdateIndexType](#) operation. For more information, see [Turning on cross-Region search by creating an aggregator index](#) in the *AWS Resource Explorer User Guide*.

For more details about what happens when you turn on Resource Explorer in an AWS Region, see [Turn on Resource Explorer to index your resources in an AWS Region](#) in the *AWS Resource Explorer User Guide*.

If this is the first AWS Region in which you've created an index for Resource Explorer, then this operation also [creates a service-linked role](#) in your AWS account that allows Resource Explorer to enumerate your resources to populate the index.

## Minimum permissions

To run this command, you must have the following permissions:

- **Action:** `resource-explorer-2:CreateIndex`

**Resource:** The ARN of the index (as it will exist after the operation completes) in the AWS Region and account in which you're trying to create the index. Use the wildcard character (\*) at the end of the string to match the eventual UUID. For example, the following Resource element restricts the role or user to creating an index in only the us-east-2 Region of the specified account.

```
"Resource": "arn:aws:resource-explorer-2:us-west-2:<account-id>:index/*"
```

Alternatively, you can use "Resource": "\*" to allow the role or user to create an index in any Region.

- **Action:** iam:CreateServiceLinkedRole

**Resource:** No specific resource (\*).

This permission is required only the first time you create an index to turn on Resource Explorer in the account. Resource Explorer uses this to create the [service-linked role needed to index the resources in your account](#). Resource Explorer uses the same service-linked role for all additional indexes you create afterwards.

## Related operations

- To turn off Resource Explorer in an AWS Region, use [DeleteIndex](#).
- To retrieve the details for an index and check its state or its type, use [GetIndex](#).
- To list all of the indexes in the AWS account, use [ListIndexes](#).
- To convert a local index to an aggregator index, use [UpdateIndexType](#).

This value helps ensure idempotency. Resource Explorer uses this value to prevent the accidental creation of duplicate versions. We recommend that you generate a [UUID-type value](#) to ensure the uniqueness of your index.

Type: String

Required: No

## Tags

The specified tags are attached only to the index created in this AWS Region. The tags aren't attached to any of the resources listed in the index.

Type: String to string map

Required: No

# DeleteIndex

You can have only one aggregator index per AWS account. Before you can promote a different index to be the aggregator index for the account, you must first demote the existing aggregator index to type LOCAL.

- **LOCAL index type**

The index contains information about resources in only the AWS Region in which the index exists. If an aggregator index in another Region exists, then information in this local index is replicated to the aggregator index.

When you change the index type to LOCAL, Resource Explorer turns off the replication of resource information from all other AWS Regions in the AWS account to this Region. The aggregator index remains in the UPDATING state until all replication with other Regions successfully stops. You can check the status of the asynchronous task by using the [GetIndex](#)

operation. When Resource Explorer successfully stops all replication with other Regions, the Status response of that operation changes from UPDATING to ACTIVE. Separately, the resource information from other Regions that was previously stored in the index is deleted within 30 days by another background task. Until that asynchronous task completes, some results from other Regions can continue to appear in search results.

### Important

After you demote an aggregator index to a local index, you must wait 24 hours before you can promote another index to be the new aggregator index for the account.

# Common Error Types

This section lists common error types that this AWS service may return. Not all services return all error types listed here. For errors specific to an API action for this service, see the topic for that API action.

## **AccessDeniedException**

You don't have permission to perform this action. Verify that your IAM policy includes the required permissions.

HTTP Status Code: 403

## **ExpiredTokenException**

The security token included in the request has expired. Request a new security token and try again.

HTTP Status Code: 403

## **IncompleteSignature**

The request signature doesn't conform to AWS standards. Verify that you're using valid AWS credentials and that your request is properly formatted. If you're using an SDK, ensure it's up to date.

HTTP Status Code: 403

## **InternalFailure**

The request can't be processed right now because of an internal server issue. Try again later. If the problem persists, contact AWS Support.

HTTP Status Code: 500

## **MalformedHttpRequestException**

The request body can't be processed. This typically happens when the request body can't be decompressed using the specified content encoding algorithm. Verify that the content encoding header matches the compression format used.

HTTP Status Code: 400

**NotAuthorized**

You don't have permissions to perform this action. Verify that your IAM policy includes the required permissions.

HTTP Status Code: 401

**OptInRequired**

Your AWS account needs a subscription for this service. Verify that you've enabled the service in your account.

HTTP Status Code: 403

**RequestAbortedException**

The request was aborted before a response could be returned. This typically happens when the client closes the connection.

HTTP Status Code: 400

**RequestEntityTooLargeException**

The request entity is too large. Reduce the size of the request body and try again.

HTTP Status Code: 413

**RequestTimeoutException**

The request timed out. The server didn't receive the complete request within the expected time frame. Try again.

HTTP Status Code: 408

**ServiceUnavailable**

The service is temporarily unavailable. Try again later.

HTTP Status Code: 503

**ThrottlingException**

Your request rate is too high. The AWS SDKs automatically retry requests that receive this exception. Reduce the frequency of requests.

HTTP Status Code: 400

## **UnknownOperationException**

The action or operation isn't recognized. Verify that the action name is spelled correctly and that it's supported by the API version you're using.

HTTP Status Code: 404

## **UnrecognizedClientException**

The X.509 certificate or AWS access key ID you provided doesn't exist in our records. Verify that you're using valid credentials and that they haven't expired.

HTTP Status Code: 403

## **ValidationError**

The input doesn't meet the required format or constraints. Check that all required parameters are included and that values are valid.

HTTP Status Code: 400

# Making API requests

Query requests for the AWS Resource Explorer are HTTP or HTTPS requests that use an HTTP verb such as GET or POST.

## Resource Explorer endpoints

An *endpoint* is a URL that serves as an entry point for a web service. You can select an appropriate AWS Region endpoint when you make your requests to reduce latency. For information about the endpoints used by Resource Explorer, see [AWS Resource Explorer](#) in the *Amazon Web Services General Reference*.

## Query parameters

Each query request must include some common parameters to handle authentication and selection of an action. For more information, see [Common Parameters](#).

Some API operations take lists of parameters. These lists are specified using the following notation:

```
param.member.n
```

Values of *n* are integers starting from 1. All lists of parameters must follow this notation, including lists that contain only one parameter. A query parameter list looks like the following example.

```
&attribute.member.1=this  
&attribute.member.2=that
```

## Request identifiers

In every response from an AWS Query API, there is a `ResponseMetadata` element, which contains a `RequestId` element. This string is a unique identifier that AWS assigns to provide tracking information. Although `RequestId` is included as part of every response, it isn't listed on the individual API documentation pages to improve readability and to reduce redundancy.

## Query API authentication

You can send query requests over either HTTP or HTTPS. Regardless of which protocol you use, you must include a signature in every query request. For more information about creating and including a signature, see [Signing AWS API Requests](#) in the *Amazon Web Services General Reference*.

## Making API requests using the POST method

If you don't use one of the AWS SDKs, you can make Resource Explorer requests over HTTP using the POST request method. The POST method requires that you specify the operation in the header of the request and provide the data for the operation in JSON format in the body of the request.

Host	The AWS Resource Explorer endpoint. For example: <code>tagging.us-east-1.amazonaws.com</code>
